
"Only an Open Heart Will Catch a Dream


It's graduation time at St. Joseph's Indian School!

Each month, you send a gift to St. Joseph's Indian School with the intent to provide Lakota (Sioux) children the essentials they need for success. Each month, you're putting your trust in our school to carry out that intent. Together, our partnership has accomplished some truly wonderful things over the last school year! As we near graduation, we've reached one pinnacle on this journey of milestones.

Because of your help, 22 eighth-grade graduates will receive their completion certificates this May. Of our 22 graduates, five of them have been at St. Joseph's since the first grade, a total of eight years. Two have been here since the second grade, or seven years. While another three have been here since the third grade, or six years.

In fact, the average enrollment stay of any child in this eighth grade class is four-and-a-half years. But those years were once months. Those months were once weeks. Those weeks were once days.





The eighth-grade graduates of 2023 chose their class motto, "Only an Open Heart Will Catch a Dream." It's fitting for a number of reasons. Each child had to open their heart to counselors, teachers, houseparents and other staff members in order to dream of a brighter future. However, that could not have happened without you.
